CORBITT'S COMMENTS

Corbitt's Comments for September 2018

As I continue to think about the subject of unity in our Association, the principle of unity within a local church has become more and more a concern for me. As Baptists we believe in congregational polity. That is, we believe that individual churches are led to make decisions through the Holy Spirit guiding their members collectively. The Holy Spirit inhabits the lives of believers, and He guides us to follow God's leading and God's will. The way we express this leadership of the Holy Spirit is through democratic processes: essentially we take votes in church conferences (or business meetings). We follow this same process at the Association; messengers from churches meet together in our Annual Meeting to make decisions in this same manner. In-between Annual Meetings our Executive Committee operates through democratic processes also. Baptists are not a people who believe in democratic practices per se; we are a people who believe in the leadership of the Holy Spirit expressed through democratic means. It is a distinction that makes a difference.

One thing that concerns me greatly is that in many churches today the process of making decisions collectively under the leadership of the Holy Spirit has degenerated and deteriorated. Too often church leaders dread holding church conferences or business meetings because they have become the locus of conflict and confusion.

Often, the "real church conference" takes place in the parking lot after the official meeting has concluded. In these "parking lot conferences" church members who sat silent in the official meeting will complain about decisions that were made; indeed they may complain about the very decisions for which they voted "yes" due to peer pressure or other reason!

All too often church members who disagree with a decision made in church conference will "vote with their feet" or "vote with their pocket book." What that means is that they decide not to attend church or to withhold their tithes and offerings until they get their way. None of this honors God or helps their church to serve Him effectively.

We all need to re-evaluate our walk with God and our willingness to follow the leading of His Spirit. No system is perfect; our Baptist system of congregational polity isn't because we are human and we are imperfect followers of our Lord. At the same time, as Baptists it is what we believe in and what we have practiced in America for over 300 years. When a church meets under the leadership of the Holy Spirit and makes a decision I believe it is incumbent upon the members of that church to recognize it for what it is - the leadership of God and an indicator of His will for that congregation. Then we need to do our best to carry out that decision and so make the ministry of our church a success.
