CORBITT'S COMMENTS

Corbitt Comments for April 2019,

"Jesus said unto him, 'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."" We all know that Jesus commanded us to love God first, but he also expects us to love our neighbors as well if we are to be obedient to the spirit of the Law. Our love must not only have a vertical component (to God) but also a horizontal component to our neighbors. Sadly, some leaders and members of some congregations in the Southern Baptist Convention have violated the second half of that equation in the worst way possible.

The *Houston Chronicle* recently published an expose' in which they revealed that literally hundreds of cases in which children and other vulnerable members of SBC churches have suffered abuse *AT CHURCH OR BY CHURCH LEADERS*. My friends this should not be so! If anyplace in the world should be a safe place it should be a church, and if any people in the world should be safe people it should be church people!

As your Director of Missions, I have no authority to direct a church to do anything, but I implore you to take the steps necessary to prevent any such thing happening in one of our CBA churches! Many trite sayings have a grain of truth in them, and in this case, an ounce of prevention is worth much more than a pound of cure.

First, Jesus also said, "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to stumble, it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were thrown into the sea."

We need to do whatever we can to prevent one of our children from being harmed; either from outside our fellowship or, God forbid, from the inside. We MUST protect our children.

Second, and much less importantly, the church no longer has the benefit of the doubt when it comes to the world. Should such an offense occur in one of our churches today, that fellowship's ministry would be greatly damaged, maybe even beyond repair. We also MUST protect our Gospel witness.

The Alabama Baptist Convention (<u>www.alsbom.org/Safe</u>) and other denominational agencies offer help to churches of all sizes in this area. *Ministry Safe* (<u>https://ministrysafe.com/</u>) is a non-denominational group which has a great reputation in this area also.

I am urging all of our churches to find the right solution for their needs, and we at the CBA are glad to help as well; but the most important thing is that we act decisively to protect our children, remembering that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven."
