Corbitt' Comments for November 2019

We have all heard the saying that there are only two certainties in life: death and taxes! I would like to add a third certainty as well: change.

As much as it makes us uncomfortable, and as much as we'd like to resist it, frustrate it, and outright stop it, change happens. Just as soon as we get acclimatized to the cool of winter, the heat of summer thrusts itself upon us. Our children grow and mature, and as they do their habits and their preferences change. Often, we find ourselves facing changes in health, employment status, and personal finances.

Our churches also experience change. Pastors and other ministers are called to a church where they do God's work for a particular season. Then, in God's timing, they are called away to other fields where God has work for them to do. Lay leaders and other church members come and go as God leads and our churches are led by God to try new ministries and organizations, sometimes alongside the existing programs, and sometimes in place of long-standing and beloved ministries of a church.

Like our homes and our churches, our society changes also. Pastimes and fads are popular one minute, and then they are old hat the next. Ethics and mores change, especially as our society becomes increasingly secular and people are less inclined to become involved in a church or other organized expression of spirituality and faith. Although we live in rural, small town Alabama, our society can no longer be compared to that reflected in the "Andy Griffith Show." Even our protected, southern Alabama society has been affected by modernity and progressive thought. As I have often said to people, "We don't live in Mayberry anymore."

Not all these changes are bad; some are neutral, and others are even welcomed, but all change can be unsettling. It is easy for us to feel uncomfortable, and even disturbed, at the seemingly endless changes we experience. In the face of this unremitting change, I would like to encourage us with a few unchanging truths.

First, God hasn't changed. He is the same today as He was yesterday, and as He will be tomorrow. And we can trust Him! As the old hymn quotes the Apostle Paul, "I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able, to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day!"

Second, God's Great Commission for us and our churches hasn't changed. He still, to this day, expects us to go and make disciples. He calls us out and quips us for that purpose and He gives us Spiritual Gifts and Godly leaders to help us fulfill that task.

Finally, the commitment of our Association to assist our churches hasn't changed:
