Corbitt's Comments for March 2020

For those of us who don't like darkness falling so soon in the afternoon, the change to Daylight Saving Time is right around the corner. Of course, changing our alarm clocks doesn't change our body clocks in the least. Like many people, I find that, the older I get, the harder it is to adjust to the twice-yearly time change. Even though the difference in the time is only one hour, I have difficulty falling asleep an hour earlier and that I want to sleep an extra hour in the morning. One hour should not make that big a difference, but it dues.

The change of time affects children and animals even more greatly. Babies don't know that clocks have changed and they get hungry when they get hungry. Roosters will crow at dawn regardless of what an alarm clock says. It can take a couple of weeks before everything settles down and all concerned get back to a normal routine. Then, six months later, we do it all over again!

Truth be told, I really should find it easier to adjust to Daylight Saving Time than most people in Alabama because I grew up on Eastern Time. Russell County has kept Eastern Time for decades. It is common to hear people talk about "fast time" and "slow time" in east Alabama because of that difference. Sometimes trying to add or subtract an hour as you plan a trip or an appointment is more tricky than one might think!

Our modern concept of time zones is not a natural phenomenon. For most of history people lived by the natural rhythms of dawn, noontime, and dusk. It was only the advent of train travel that resulted in the development of the modern system of time zones. I am still bemused, however, that I can fly from Atlanta to Montgomery and, according to my automatically adjusted cell phone clock, arrive before I departed Atlanta!

Spiritually, I'd like to compare our time change struggles with the way we deal with sin, ethics, and morality. Regardless of what we as humans may call something, it doesn't change its actual nature. We can change our clocks, but the Sun will be at its zenith when the astrophysics determine it should be. In the same way, when we call something that is wrong "right" and something that is right "wrong" it does not change the essential nature of those items. Instead, we are just deceiving ourselves. One definition of "wisdom" is "seeing things from God's point of view." What we call "right" and "wrong" doesn't really matter. What matters is what God calls "right" and "wrong."

So, on March 8th, when you "spring forward" not only should we change the batteries in our smoke detectors (which is excellent practice), we should also remember the futility of imposing our own views on the standards established by God.
