#### **CORBITT'S COMMENTS**

Corbitt's Comments for June 2020

We all know that ministry can be challenging. If we didn't understand that before the impact of COVID-19 on our churches we certainly should understand it after the recent storm which had an impact on large portions of our County. Just when it seemed like ministry could not get more difficult, our County was hit by a tornado and strong straight-line winds which damaged property and uprooted or broke many dozens of trees.

Of course, what might look like a difficult situation, if seen in another light, might turn out to be an opportunity for ministry. This was true for our Disaster Relief Team:

The very morning after the storm had passed, our Disaster Relief volunteers launched into action, cutting trees and tarping roofs, and helping people to clean up in the aftermath of the wind and rain. Our Disaster Relief volunteers worked hard for six days, helping widows and people with disabilities, while assisting church members and members of the community alike. They put tarps on two roofs, and they removed (some very large) trees from fifteen homes. Their Christian witness during this time was impeccable!

Our Association has maintained a Disaster Relief ministry for nearly fifteen years, starting with our Disaster Laundry Unit and then adding our Clean-up/Recovery and Chainsaw Unit. We also have a number of trained chaplains in our ranks as well. Our volunteers have responded to disasters in states like Louisiana, Florida, and South Carolina as well as places in our own state such as Elba, but this was the first time we have responded to help the people of our own County, and we were glad to be able to do it!

Because of funding from our churches and the Christian Service Centers, our team is well equipped with the necessary chainsaws and safety equipment. Our most recently purchased item of equipment, a tractor with a grapple lift, was worth its weight in gold, allowing our team to complete more assignments in the same day, and allowing them to remove some very large trees from houses and driveways!

The one resource we need more of is volunteers. Because they are volunteers, only a percentage of our trained DR personnel can respond at any given moment. All training for new DR volunteers has been suspended for a time due to the COVID-19 situation, but when training does resume, we will be issuing an invitation so that we can increase our number of volunteers. We would ask that you pray about becoming involved in this dynamic ministry!
