CORBITT'S COMMENTS

Corbitt's Comments for May 2022

One of our greatest needs, coming out of two years of dealing with an unpredictable epidemic, is to revive our outreach and evangelism ministries. I am aware that finding the best ways to do this is a challenge in the 21st Century but sharing the Gospel must be a central aspect of our ministry for both spiritual and practical reasons.

Spiritually, if we are to love Jesus, and He certainly deserves our love, we must obey His commandments. The last commandments Jesus gave us before He ascended into Heaven were to make disciples of all peoples, and to be a witness for Him wherever we go. These are not optional; they are commandments that God expects us to obey.

Practically, we need to remember that the church in general, and our local church we love so much in particular, is only one generation away from extinction. If we don't do outreach, and if we don't do evangelism, we will soon have no congregation with which to attend our church!

One type of outreach our churches can do immediately is to contact the visitors that we had attend our Easter worship services. So many more people will attend church on Easter Sunday than on a normal Lord's Day, and a large percentage of them either need to be saved, or to revive their walk with Christ. Just greeting them warmly and welcoming them to church on Easter is not enough. We need to follow-up with them, invite them back to church, and yes, even share the Gospel with them. Since they came to our church, we should take that as an expression of interest and as an invitation to engage them with the love of Christ. As the saying goes, we need to make hay while the sun shines!

A second type of outreach we need to be planning and praying about is Vacation Bible School. Historically, 25% of all baptisms each year in the Southern Baptist Convention stem from VBS. If your church has not had a VBS over the past couple of years (and there were valid reasons not to at the time), 2022 is probably the right time to relaunch this ministry and now is the time to begin planning, praying, and preparing for a good school. Pat Kelley at our Christian Book and Gift Shop will be glad to help you acquire the right curriculum for your church. Curricula are available for all sizes of churches and all types of communities, so don't let that stop you from holding a VBS this summer. And don't forget to follow-up with the families of the children who will attend VBS at your church! They have expressed an interest in your church, which, again, we should take as an invitation to reach out to

Outreach and evangelism can be hard, but if we take advantage of the natural opportunities afforded to us by such instances as Easter Sunday and VBS we can grow our churches, we can grow God's Kingdom, and ultimately, we can grow the population of Heaven!
