CORBITT'S COMMENTS

The Psalms are wonderful because they are beautiful poetry, but also because they revealed truths that apply to today's world as well as in the time they were written. An example of this is the "Holy Trilogy" in the Psalms: Psalm 22, Psalm 23, and Psalm 24. In these three, David shared visions of Christ on the Cross (Psalm 22), of Christ as the Good Shepherd (Psalm 23), and of Christ as the King of Kings (Psalm 24). From these we can see what Christ did for us in the past, what He is doing for us in the present, and what He will do for us in the future. As the leadership of the CBA reviews its ministry plans and strategies, we must keep all three of these dimensions in mind.

First, we must remember from where we have come. Associations have a rich history in Southern Baptist life, and they, in fact, were the first denominational entities formed by Baptists. Autonomous churches, willingly associating together, defined who Baptists are and what we believe, long before there were any Bible colleges and seminaries. After conventions were established, associations were key partners with them in training church leaders and mobilizing church members for missions, including promoting the Cooperative Program.

Next, we must realize that associations, like churches, are recovering from the prolonged effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The collective ministries that pastors and church members previously found to be useful are not as well supported as they once were. Fewer churches look to their local association for equipping and training their leaders, because they have found other sources of equipping that they prefer, or because they no longer train-up leaders in their church as they did before. Times have changed, and the expressed (and unexpressed) needs of churches have changed.

What about the future? That, as the saying goes, is the "\$64,000 question." I cannot predict the future of associational life in the SBC, but I can say that the future is getting here quicker than it used to. Dr. Thom Rainer has said that the rate of change in church life was accelerated by at least three years due to the experience of COVID-19 pandemic. We must be prepared to face and embrace the future of our cooperative ministry as God reveals it to us.

As your leadership reviews our collective ministry, we cannot live in the past, because there is no future in it. We cannot live only in the present because it does not provide us with the perspective we need. We cannot live in the future, because, unless it is revealed to us by God, we cannot predict what tomorrow may bring. Pray for the CBA and your leaders as we prayerfully consider the past, the present, and the future as we seek to follow God's direction for our Association.
