CORBITT'S COMMENTS

The results of our ministry survey are in, and the conclusions are both interesting and confusing in about equal proportions. Let me explain:

We received survey results during the month of June, and I was pleased with both the number of responses and the broad spectrum of church members who completed the survey. While it was not a perfect instrument, I have a lot of confidence in the data which we gathered. This is good, but it also poses a significant challenge.

The interesting part of our survey results is that the expressed needs of our churches have not really changed since 2014. After a decade of societal changes, the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and changes in pastors and other church leadership, the needs of our churches are basically the same. Also interesting is that there was broad agreement that our three major ministry areas (Encourage & Equip Ministers & Churches, Community Missions, and Global Missions) constitute the correct strategy for us to follow to meet those needs. This should be reassuring, but instead, I saw some other data that caused me considerable confusion and concern.

The confusing part of our survey results is this: overall, about 40% of our respondents had no experience or no opinion of our ministry efforts. That is, although our ministry is designed to help churches with the needs that they express they have, nearly half of those who responded didn't know enough about what we do to have an opinion about our ministry. This reminds me of the old question, "If a tree falls in the forest, and no one sees it, does it make a sound?"

In closing, I want to thank everyone who completed the survey. I appreciate your time and contribution and I assure you we will take this information seriously. The Board of Directors and I will be carefully reviewing this information in the months to come. Please pray with me and the members of the Board as we discern God's guidance for the future of our collective ministry.
