CORBITT'S COMMENTS

Dear Friends.

One of the most common causes of conflict in church life in recent years is church worship music. I was raised in a church that sang hymns, and which had an excellent choir and many talented musicians. I was introduced to praise choruses in England, and then when I moved to Covington County, I learned about shaped-note hymns. Because my wife and I visit different a different member church almost every Sunday, I have a few observations about the worship practices of churches in our county.

First, people sing the songs that they know the best. Often this means singing from a hymn book, but this is not always the case. Worship leaders who want to hear their congregation singing enthusiastically should do their best to introduce new songs to their church members in a way that will help them to learn them so they can feel comfortable singing them. Conversely, church members need to be willing to learn new songs. Many years ago in an instructors training course, I learned that the factor most likely to provide confidence to an instructor is knowledge of the subject. I would say the same thing is true of the hymns, choruses, and worship songs that we sing in our churches today.

Second, the genre of music used in worship does not matter as much as its quality. I must confess that I am not a huge fan of Southern Gospel music, but I am blessed by high quality Southern Gospel music. We should do the very best we can for our Lord in all parts of our life, but particularly in worship. Poorly played music, which is poorly planned, and poorly conducted, will squelch the spirit of worship on a Sunday morning. High quality music may not guarantee high quality worship, but it does not inhibit it either.

I can worship from the Baptist Hymnal or from a shaped note hymnal or with worship songs or by listening to Southern Gospel. I worship best, however, when I know the songs and the songs are well led. I encourage us all to pursue these ideas in our worship going forward.
